Appropriate Assessment for Part 8 application for **Living in Carlingford, Visiting Carlingford, Carlingford, Co. Louth.**

Louth County Council, in accordance with Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC) and Regulation 42(1) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 as amended, has undertaken Appropriate Assessment Screening on the proposed development of **Living in Carlingford Visiting Carlingford Regeneration Scheme, Carlingford, Co. Louth** to assess, in view of best scientific knowledge and the conservation objectives of the site, if the works, individually or in combination with other plans or projects, are likely to have a significant effect on a European Site(s).

In accordance with Article 6(3) of the EU Habitats Directive (Directive 92/43/EEC) and Regulation 42(1) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, as amended, Louth County Council has made a determination that Appropriate Assessment is not required, as it can be concluded on the basis of information provided by **RPS Group Limited** in their report titled **Living in Carlingford, Visiting Carlingford RRDF Project, Report to Inform Screening for Appropriate Assessment**, that the works, individually or in combination with other plans or projects, are not likely to have a significant effect on any European Sites.
